LEGISLATION COMPLIANCE IN FOOD ANIMAL MEDICINE

Under **AMDUCA** and **21 CFR part 530**, the FDA places restrictions on extra label drug use (ELDU) for certain drugs in food animal medicine.

ELDU refers to the use of a medication in a manner **not explicitly approved.** (i.e. For a different species, condition, dosage, or route of administration!

Drugs with NO Allowable Extra-Label Uses¹

- Chloramphenicol
- Clenbuterol
- Diethylstilbestrol (DES)
- Fluoroquinolone-class antibiotics (Including Enrofloxacin)
- Glycopeptides (Including Vancomycin)

- Medicated feeds
- Nitroimidazoles (Including Dimetridazole, Ipronidazole, Metronidazol)
- Nitrofurans (Including Furazolidone and Nitrofurazone)

Drugs with
Restrictions in
Specific
Species and
Situations¹

- ELDU Prohibited in all food producing animals: Indexed drugs²
- **ELDU Prohibited in Poultry:** Adamantane & Neuraminidase Inhibitors
- ELDU Prohibited in feed or food of all species: Gentian violet
- ELDU Prohibited in female dairy cattle greater than 20 months of age: Phenylbutazone
- **ELDU Prohibited in lactating dairy cattle:** Sulfonamide-class antibiotics, except on-label use of sulfadimethoxine, sulfabromomethazine, and sulfaethoxypyridazine.
- Fully prohibited in Grade "A" Dairy Operations: non-medical grade DMSO, dipyrone, and colloidal silver are prohibited

ELDU Restrictions of Cephalosporins (except Cephapirin)

For Cattle, Pigs, Chickens, and Turkeys, use is restricted when:

- 1. The product is used for purposes other than those specified on the label (dosage, treatment duration, frequency, or administration route)
- 2. The product is used in non-approved species or animal classes
- 3. When the product is used for disease prevention.

For all other species, ELDU is permitted
